## Chapter One - McDuck Family History

The McDuck, Duck, and Coot families are old, established lines whose names are well-known due to the many well-publicized stories by their biographer, the late Walt E. Disney and his successors. The families are very closely related due to numerous inter-marriages as well as inter-marriages with other families, notably the Rockerduck, Mallard, O'Drake, and von Drake lines. In addition to these, the families also are connected to the following lines: Gander, Goose, McFowl, Naldo, von Concius, Gadwall, Grebe, Loon, McHaggis, Patatinhas, Picaljean, Tinhas, Vermund, and de Canard. These families are truly international in nature in that one can find clans in Scotland, families in America, and relatives in many of the various European counties.

Many genealogists have researched these families. Some of the first were associates of Mr. Disney, a Mr. Carl Bark and a Don Rosa, an engineer from the University of Kentucky. Your writer began his interest in the families back in his youth, but became more serious in June 2004. Another genealogist who has looked into the families is the well-known Dick Eastman. He wrote of the family in the 8 May 2005 issue of his "Eastman's Online Genealogy Newsletter".

The Duck Family is well-known since 1564. Pintail Duck sailed in the West-Indies onboard the British ship "The Falcon". He probably drowned when the ship sunk. Nothing further is known about the family before Detlef Duck appears some time in the very late 1700s.

His great great grandson, Quackmore Duck married Hortense McDuck and thus also connected the Ducks and the old Scottish clan McDuck. The McDucks is a very old, and in earlier times a very rich Scottish Clan belonging to the aristocracy. The first known McDuck is Eider McDuck (880-946). But, some sources show the history of the Clan McDuck from 122 A.D. and until 1877 when Uncle \$crooge is 10 years old. Thus a McDuck and his stinginess was present at all the great moments of Scottish history.

The McDuck clan used to spell their name the gaelic way; MacDuich until 1071 when they changed the spelling of their name to the well known McDuck. Like Uncle \$crooge, the old McDucks were also very mean. When \$crooge was born in 1867, the McDuck family was poor (but they still owned their Castle at Dismal Downs) and lived in Glasgow.

According to Scottish legends, the clan McDuck can be followed back to 122 A.D. By then an unknown member of the family sold rocks to the Romans who built the wall of Hadrian. The first known member of the family: Sir Eider McDuck (Around 880-946). He fell in a battle against the Saxons after his men deserted him because he only paid 30 copper-pieces per hour.

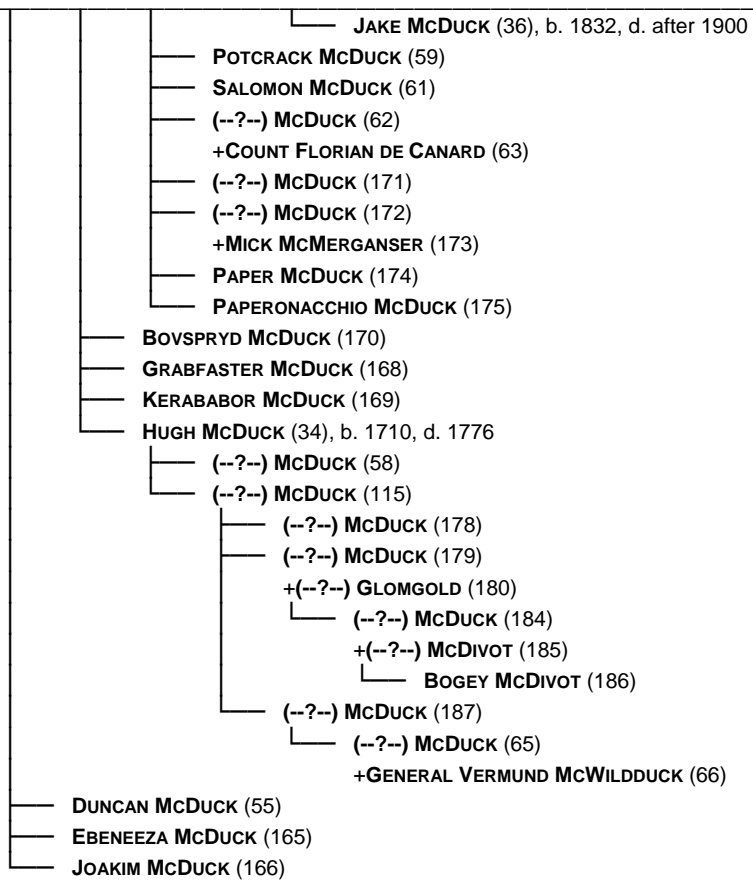
The Coots were in America for many years... They came over either on the Mayflower or to Jamestown. But there could be other nationalities mixed in by the time of Cornelius Coot, so it would have to be said that that branch of the family is truly "melting-pot" American

Some important members of the family are Cornelius Coot who founded Duckburg, Clinton Coot who founded The Junior Woodchucks and Casey Coot (brother of Grandma Duck) who sold Uncle \$crooge the ground where he built his money bin, and, of course, "Grandma" Elvira (Coot) Duck who married Humperdink Dink and connected the three Coot, Duck and McDuck families.

Many of the family have been found to be present at almost all of the world's historical events and may well have influenced the outcome of more than a few of them. To include all of them in a comprehensive family history would thus be a huge project and would almost be tantamount to writing a history of the world.

This small booklet represents only a small part of the families. In fact, only the small McDuck family originating in Dismal Downs, Scotland is considered for this study.

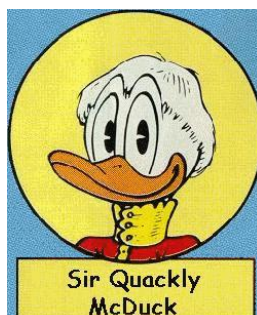

## Chapter Three - Descendants of Sir Quackly McDuck (45)

### Generation One



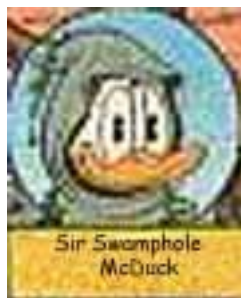

In return for protecting King MacBeth in the McDuck Castle in the Civil War of 1057, Sir Quackly McDuck (45) received a chest from the Scottish Treasury. But he got carried away with protecting his new gold and accidentally sealed himself into a wall inside the Castle, together with his treasure.<sup>5</sup> As of before 1071, he was also known as MacDuich (45) his last name should be spelled "MacDuich," because the clan didn't start to spell their name "McDuck" before 1071 when William the conqueror invaded Scotland.<sup>6,7</sup>

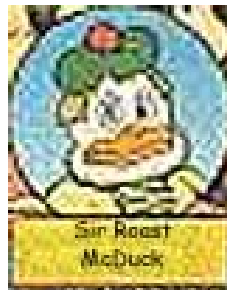

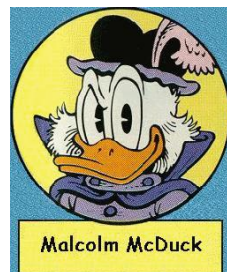

He was also called Matey (43).<sup>18</sup> He was a British naval officer at the Carribean. Records show that in the 1560's a McDuck served aboard the HMS FALCON ROVER under Capt. Loyal Hawk as he raided the Spanish Caribbean trade routes.

Once Matey McDuck and a sailor named Pintail Duck (2) buried a treasure that actually consisted of potatoes.<sup>19</sup> In 1579 Malcolm McDuck (43) sailed together with Sir Francis Drake as the "first mate" of the GOLDEN HIND. Shortly after he became the first commander of the new Fort Drake Borough and thus became the first McDuck in what later became known as Duckburg.<sup>20</sup>

But in 1753, Swindle McSue tricked him into a contract to deliver some horseradish to Jamaica - then scuttled the GOOSE! Seafoam forfeited the McDuck home and belongings to McSue, escaping with only the heirloom watch in his pocket, and the golden dentures in his mouth!<sup>80</sup>

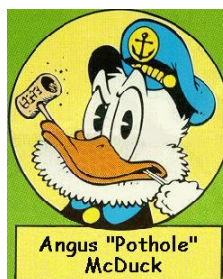

He was called Pothole (37), a nickname for a riverboater... a pothole being a round depression dug in the riverbed mud by the water currents.<sup>147</sup> Angus never married. While his younger brothers remained in Scotland, Angus went to America. It's still unknown when he left for America, but it was probably sometime late in the 1840s. In America, he ended up as a riverboat captain on the Mississippi.

Around 1850, Angus was a cabin boy on the riverboat DRENNAN WHYTE, which sailed on the Mississippi. It sunk with a cargo of US government gold bars worth \$ 100,000 while he was onboard. Angus was the only survivor and he kept searching for the gold until he and Scrooge finally found it in 1880.

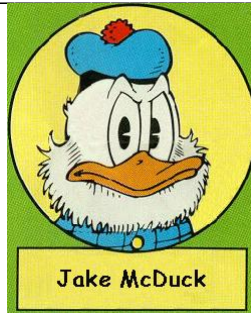
In the great steamboat race in 1870, Angus and another riverboater, named Porker Hogg, ended up in a race to settle the ownership of the estate of "Cornpone Gables", but the race ended with a draw since none of them were able to finish the race. Angus' river boat at that time was the stern-wheeler, COTTON QUEEN.

In the period 1880-1882, his nephew, Scrooge joined him. By then Angus had another river boat called the DILLY DOLLAR that he claimed was "the fastest steamer on the river!" The two first met in Louisville, Kentucky, one of the main ports in the Mississippi River system, in 1880. And the reason for that was that all river traffic had always been forced to stop at Louisville due to the Falls of the Ohio which are located here (or I should say, Louisville is located at the Falls of the Ohio).

In 1882, after tutoring Scrooge for two years, Angus sold the DILLY DOLLAR to the lad at a bargain price. At first that made Scrooge wonder if his uncle was a real McDuck, but after a while, when the railroad started to take over the business from the steamboats, Scrooge realised that Angus knew very well what he did.

As for Angus, he retired to New Orleans where he started writing dime novels about his adventures. In the early 1890's he dealt with a great Western show including Buffalo Bill and the Apache chief, Geronimo.<sup>148</sup>

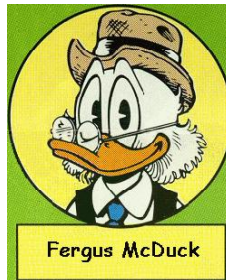

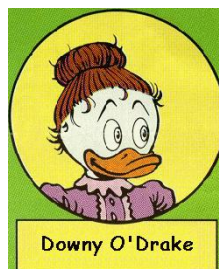

Downy O'Drake (31)<sup>176,177</sup> was born in 1830 at Ireland.<sup>178</sup> She died in 1897 at McDuck Castle, Dismal Downs, Scotland, as mentioned in a letter from her husband, Fergus to their son, Scrooge.<sup>179</sup>

Scrooge McDuck

- 56 i. Scrooge<sup>13</sup> McDuck (13)<sup>180.181.182</sup> was born in 1867 and seemed to be the rebirth of the 16th century sea captain, Matey McDuck (43).<sup>183.184</sup> He died in 1967 at Duckburg, Calisota, USA of Ducks.<sup>185</sup> He met Sir Quackly McDuck (45)'s ghost when he first visited McDuck Castle alone in 1877. At that point Sir Quackly didn't tell Scrooge where to find his treasure because he believed that Scrooge should learn to earn his own money during hard work first.<sup>186</sup> He earned his first dime in 1877 10 years at Scotland.<sup>187</sup> In 1880 Scrooge McDuck (13) left at Scotland for America 13 years.<sup>188</sup> He and his's ghost met again at McDuck Castle in 1885. At that point Sir Quackly tried to help Scrooge against the Whiskervilles.<sup>189</sup> In 1898, after many adventures, Scrooge McDuck (13) finally ended up at the Klondike, Alaska, USA of Ducks. There he found a golden rock at the size of a goose egg. The next year he reached his first \$1,000,000 and bought the deed for Kill Mule Hill from Casey Coot, the son of Clinton Coot and grandson of Cornelius Coot.<sup>190</sup> He lived in 1902 at Duckburg, Calisota, USA of Ducks.<sup>191</sup> The richest Duck in the world. One might say that if Cornelius Coot was the founder of the 19th century town called Duckburg, Scrooge McDuck was indeed the founder of the 20th century city with the same name. Since he owns 99% of the city it has in effect become "McDuckburg".

After some dramatic events where he faced both the Beagle Boys and president Roosevelt and his "Rough Riders" at the same time, he tore down the rest of the old fort Duckburg and raised his famous Money Bin at the same site.

In the years to follow, Uncle Scrooge travelled all around the world in order to increase his fortune. During these and his previous travels he learned a lot of different languages from all parts of the world. Meanwhile his family ran the Money Bin.<sup>192.193</sup> After 1902, Scrooge (13) began to be known as \$crooge McDuck (13).<sup>194</sup> Miss Emily Quackfaster (123) was hired as his secretary.<sup>195</sup> When Scrooge McDuck (13) finally returned from his world travels to Duckburg in 1930 and finding himself the richest person in the world, he had changed. The new \$crooge McDuck was tough and hostile toward his surroundings. Thus his own family left him.<sup>196</sup> In 1942, \$crooge (13) closed down his empire and retired to a big house totally unlike his previous (and later) style at Duckburg, Calisota, USA of Ducks.<sup>197</sup> He finally met his nephew, Donald Fauntleroy Duck (15) again along with his grand nephews, Deuteronomy Duck (19), Louis Duck (20) and Hubert Duck (18). In the next 20 years, they experienced more great adventures than ever before.<sup>198</sup> In the years, decades and centuries after Sir Quackly McDuck received his treasure and sealed it and himself in to a wall of McDuck Castle, many generations of McDucks searched for the remains of Sir Quackly and his treasure. Almost 900 years later Scrooge McDuck (13) in 1948 finally succeeded and on his third visit to Dismal Downs finally put an end to that search.<sup>199</sup> After returning to public life, Scrooge (13) fought an endless struggle to keep his fortune and to remain the richest man in the world. The Beagle Boys constituted a continuous threat to his fortune and counterparts like Flintheart Glomgold (124) and John D. Rockerduck (88) tried all kind of tricks to pass old Scrooge in wealth and success. In addition to this, after 1960, the Italian witch Magica De Spell chased Scrooge's first one dime without any success. Scrooge succeeded well in his struggle, but there was never much time to rest before the next battle.<sup>200</sup>



Matilda McDuck

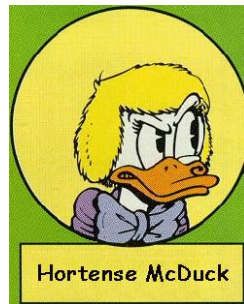

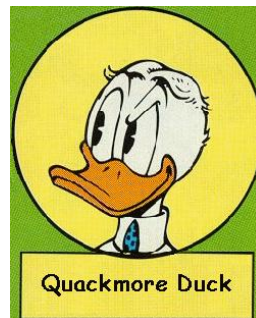

Quackmore Duck (4)<sup>240,241,242</sup> was born circa 1875 at Duckburg, Calisota, USA of Ducks.<sup>243</sup> He grew up at the Duck Farm outside Duckburg, Calisota, USA of Ducks.<sup>244</sup> In 1902, Quackmore Duck (4), the eldest of three siblings, met Hortense McDuck (14) a young Scottish girl just arrived from Scotland, with a temper very similar to his own.<sup>245</sup> He Until 1930 he worked for Scrooge as a book-keeper, and thus ran the business together with Scrooge's two sisters, Hortense and Matilda. Around 1908 while Scrooge were abroad they hired Miss Emily Quackfaster as Scrooge's new secretary.

Since Donald is the only family member shown in histories covering the period after 1930 we can assume that he and the rest of his family, left Duckburg some time after leaving Scrooge in 1930. Perhaps he and his wife Hortense lives the same place as their daughter Della and her husband.<sup>247</sup>

Very little is known about Donald's life from 1930 to the early 1940's. At some point, his family left Duckburg. If Donald stayed in Duckburg (possibly at Grandma Ducks's farm?) or left with his family and returned later is still unknown. What we know is that at some time in the mid-1940's, he was living in Duckburg and his three nephews Huey, Dewey and Louie moved in with him. Donald is an expert in detecting very small details. This is why he so easily can separate his nephews from each other.

Donald Duck has through the years tried all kinds of jobs without much success. This is more caused by constant bad luck and stubbornness than a lack of talent. It however seems that his Uncle \$crooge always has something for him -- like shining his coins.

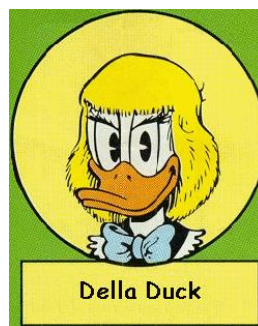
Once Donald built his own car (registered with the number 313) from spare parts. He has used it ever since.

Who is Phooey? (Besides a mistake by various sources?) One theory hearkens back to the original introduction of the nephews. It seems a firecracker had mysteriously gone off under their father's chair, sending him to the hospital. During his recovery, their mother sent them to live with their Uncle Donald, and they stayed. Could Phooey have been the bad nephew who put the firecracker under the chair? That he is not given in most sources may be explained by the fact that he may have been sent to reform school!<sup>289</sup>
